Licensing of Resources and Applications

- Epiphany, evolution, pidgin, poEdit and Seamonkey are released open source
 - IT terms translations shared online – once approved as standard translation, it will be copyrighted by Mongolian National Center for Standardization
- Corpus
 - Problems for further distributing because there is no agreement with its original publishers
- Speech corpus of 30000 utterances, 3000 dictionary of pronunciation will be openly shared
- Toolkits, Spellchecker, tag set POS and lexicon will be openly shared
 - Research results will be published with copyright to the researchers – then shared freely with others:
 - Most publications follow copyright requirements of the publisher
- Copyright infringements should be avoided: check your article using www.turnitin.com for any issues



Distribution of Resources and Applications

- Developments made on open source tools are shared online
 - Ex: www.gnome.org, www.pidgin.im, www.infocon.mn, www.sit.num.edu.mn, www.must.edu.mn portal sites
- Conferences, seminars and public media (local and international)
 - Articles on international professional journals and magazines, posters
 - Public media such as TV, Radio, Newspaper
 - Mailing lists, local professional journals such as “My computer”, “Bileg” and “Computer times” etc.,
- Used for trainings at Universities.
 - Students assignments given within framework of the proje
- Project publications
 - NLP study results and IT terms translated etc.,



Local issues



- Afraid of loosing the ownership of the research/development works to others
 - Putting online might let others to take from their work without permission/acknowledgement
 - Less willingness to share own work with others
 - Local language electronic content is still limited
- Discussions seminars help knowledge sharing problems by freely discussing and learning from each other
